- Tonight's game will mark the first time Phoenix and Minnesota meet in the playoffs on a neutral court.

<u>CHASING MORE HISTORY:</u> Already the WNBA's all-time leader in scoring and three-point field goals, **Diana Taurasi** will continue to chase history in 2020. After becoming the first player in league history to scores 8,000 career points on June 5, 2018, Taurasi is now 343 points shy of 9,000.

LEAGUE OF HER OWN:

In the Mercury's season opener against the Dallas Wings on Friday, May 18, 2018, **Diana Taurasi** became the first and only WNBA player in history to reach 1,000 career made three-pointers. Additionally, having done so in her 399th career game, Taurasi joined **Steph Curry**, **Klay Thompson** and **Damian Lillard** as the only players in WNBA/NBA history to reach 1,000 career three-pointers in 400 games or less.

<u>DEE FOR THREE</u>: In Phoenix's 99-91 win on June 1, 2017 at Chicago, **Diana Taurasi** became the league's all-time leader in three-point makes, passing **Katie Smith**. Taurasi now continues to increase that lead in 2020, as she now sits over 1,000 in her career.

*In Persepctive: Taurasi's current 1,164 made 3-pointers in 456 career games is 2.55 made threes per game for her career. Ray Allen, the NBA's all-time leader, made 2,973 in 1,300 career games, which is 2.29 threes per game.

ATOP THE CHARTS: After leading the league in three-pointers in 2018, Taurasi claims the top 6 spots for most three-pointers in a season. 2018 marked just the second time in WNBA history a player has reached 100 made three-pointers in a season, both times by her.

AGED LIKE FINE WINE: In the Mercury's win over the Las Vegas Aces on July 31, 2020, **Diana Taurasi** became the first player in WNBA history to notch at least 20 points and 10 assists in a game at the age of 38 or older. Only four NBA players in the history of the league, age 38+, have finished with at least 20 and 10 in a game in **John Stockton** (eight times), **Steve Nash** (twice), **Karl Malone** and **Michael Jordan**.

POINTS/ASSISTS DOUBLE-DOUBLES: On July 31, 2020 **Diana Taurasi** notched her 19th career double-double, finishing with 20 points and 10 assists. It Was Taurasi's 13th career double-double with points and assists, moving her into a tie for fourth with **Lindsay Whalen** for most points/assists double-doubles in WNBA history.

MVP TAURASI?: In her 17th season at the age of 38, Diana Taurasi become an MVP contender this year, finishing fifth in the league in scoring (18.7 ppg) and eighth in assists (4.5 apg). Taurasi strengthened the debate over the final nine games of the regular season, averaging 21.2 points, 4.2 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 4.1 made three-pointers during such stretch and since wearing the No. 8 'BRYANT' jersey.

MAMBA MENTALITY: In the Mercury's game on August 23 against Washington, Diana Taurasi wore a No.8 'BRYANT' jersey for the duration of the game on what would have been Kobe's 42nd birthday. Taurasi finished with a season-high 34 points after knocking down seven triples in the game. In the game, Taurasi became the first player in WNBA history to record at least 34 points, 4 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 blocks, make 7 three-pointers, make 10 free throws and shoot at least 52% from the field. The only player in NBA history to do so was **Kobe Bryant** on Jan. 31, 2007.

<u>20-7-2 CLUB</u>: In 31 games last season Brittney Griner averaged 20.7 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game, making her the only player in the WNBA in 2019 to average at least 20 points, 7 rebounds and 2 blocks per game this year. As the only player in WNBA history to average at least 20-7-2 in more than two seasons (2017-19), she joins Anthony Davis, Elton Brand, Shaquille O'Neal and Jermaine O'Neal as the only WNBA/NBA players since 2000 the average 20-7-2 in three consecutive seasons.

AIN'T NOTHIN BUT A "BG" THANG: Mercury center Brittney Griner continues to prove that she may just be the greatest rim protector in league history, as she ranks 3rd on the WNBA's all-time blocks list with 658 blocks in only 224 career games (ranks 1st among active players)...After leading the league in total blocks during the 2016 season for a fourth-straight year with 107, she recorded her third consecutive year with 100+ blocks in a season, becoming just the second WNBA player (Margo Dydek) to do so... After finishing second in total blocks in 2017 with 65 (missed 8 games due to injury - Sylvia Fowles and Elizabeth Williams each finished with 67 blocks that

season and appeared in all 34 games), Griner led the league in total blocks in 2018 with 87, 20 more than second place (Natasha Howard - 67)...Griner averaged 3.1 blocks per game in 2016, making her the first WNBA player in history to average 3.0+ blocks per game in each of her first four seasons... The last player in the NBA to average 3.0 blocks per game in each of his first four seasons in the NBA was Shawn Bradley (1993-94 to 1996-97)...She also became the 11th player in WNBA history to record 400 career blocks on 9/2 at Connecticut...She did so in 115 career games, making her the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 400 career blocks. Manute Bol, David Robinson and Mark Eaton are the only NBA players to have ever recorded 400 career blocks in 115 games or less...Griner tied for the league lead during the 2019 season in blocks per game with 2.0 ... she has led the league in blocks per game in all seven of her WNBA seasons

GRINER 600: Having tied Alonzo Mourning as the 4th fastest player in NBA/WNBA history to 500 career blocks (153 games) on June 1, 2018, Brittney Griner became the third player in WNBA history to reach 600 career blocks on July 7, 2019 against Atlanta. Having done so in her 193rd career game, she became the eigth-fastest player in NBA/WNBA

history to reach 600 blocks, and the second-fastest among WNBA players.

WNBA JAM: Mercury center Brittney Griner has recorded 12 regular-season dunks over her 224game career....dunked in her 204th career game on August 10, 2019 vs. Dallas, 187th career game on June 14, 2019 vs. Los Angeles, 138th career game on July 12, 2017 vs. Atlanta, 133rd career game on June 23, 2017 at Seattle, 115th career game on September 2, 2016 at Connecticut, 86th career game on September 11, 2015 vs. Los Angeles, 82nd career game on August 28, 2015 at Washington, 64th career game on July 5, 2015 at Los Angeles, 47th career game on July 15, 2014 vs. Washington, her 43rd career game on July 6, 2014 at Los Angeles and twice in her May 27, 2013 WNBA debut vs. Chicago making her the first player in WNBA history to dunk twice in one game.....the rest of the WNBA combined enters the 2019 season with a total of three dunks (Elias Sports Bureau).....Griner also dunked in Game 2 of the Western Conference Finals at Los Angeles on August 24, 2014, at the WNBA All-Star Game on July 19, 2014 in Phoenix, at the WNBA All-Star Game on July 25, 2015 in Connecticut and dunked three times at the WNBA All-Star game on July 27, 2019 in Las Vegas.

2018 YEAR IN REVIEW: In the most recent season **Skylar Diggins-Smith** played in (2018), the four-time All-Star put up eye-turning numbers, finishing 10th in points per game (17.9) and 3rd in assists per game (career-high 6.2). COACHING STAFF: Mercury head coach **Sandy** Brondello returns for her seventh year with the Mercury...Brondello was signed to a multi-year contract following the 2016 season on October 13, 2016....Brondello is assisted by Julie Hairgrove (16th season), the longest tenured assistant coach in the WNNBA, and former WNBA player Chasity Melvin (1st season)...The Mercury also afeature Zach O'Brien to its staff as Player Development Coach. Brondello has a career record of 145-114 as head coach in the WNBA and a 131-94 record with the Mercury as head coach, the winningest coach in franchise history. Additionally, she has the most playoff wins by a coach in Mercury history with 17. In the Mercury's win on August 4, 2020 againt Atlanta, Brondello moved into 10th place on the WNBA's all-time wins list with 135 career wins.

After tallying just eight blocks in the first 12 games of the season, Turner swatted 35 shots in the final 10 games of the regular season and averaged 12.6 rebounds and 3.5 blocks over those past nine games, while always guarding the team's best post player. NEW FACES WITH THE MERCURY: Following a busy free agency period, the Mercury feature several new faces on this year's squad. Of the 10-player roster in Phoenix, 50 percent of last year's squad remains in Diana Taurasi, Brittney Griner, Alanna Smith, Sophie Cunningham and Brianna Turner. New to this year's team is Skylar Diggins-Smith (aquired in a trade with Dallas), Kia Vaughn (signed as a free agent), Bria Hartley (signed as a free agent), Nia Coffey (aquired in a three-team trade from Atlanta) and Shatori Walker-Kimbrough (aquired in a trade on draft night from New York). Additionally, the Mercury aquired Jessica Breland in the same trade as Coffey, however Breland will miss the 2020 season after receiving a medical exemption.

THE SECOND SEASON: The Phoenix Mercury enter the 2020 WNBA Playoffs with an all-time postseason record of 41-33 (.554).....the Mercury is one of five teams in WNBA history with 30 or more playoff wins and one-of-four teams in WNBA history with three or more championships (Houston, 4; Minnesota, 4; Detroit, 3; Los Angeles, 3).....Phoenix qualified for the postseson for the 15th time this season and is one of three WNBA franchises in history with 15 or more playoff appearances.

MERC PLAYOFFS: The Mercury clinched its franchise-record eighth consecutive playoff berth this season. It will be Phoenix's 12th playoff appearance in last 14 seasons and the 15th in the franchise's 24-year history.

<u>PEDDY'S BIG NIGHT</u>: Shey Peddy was the hero of the night in the Mercury's 85-84 win over the Washington Mystics on September 15, knocking down a three-pointer from the corner as time expired to seal the win and advance Phoenix into the second round of the WNBA playoffs. Peddy, who was initially signed to a

seven-day contract by the Mercury on August 19 after being waived by the Washington Mystics, came off the bench to finish with 12 points, 4 rebounds and 3 steals. It marked the 11th time in WNBA history a player has come off the bench in the WNBA postseason and finished with at least such numbers, and the first time in Mercury franchise history (h/t Across The Timeline).

SEVENTH SEASON AS HEAD COACH OF PHOENIX



Veteran WNBA player, coach and former Australian Olympian Sandy Brondello (braun-DELL-oh) was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on November 15, 2013. Brondello also serves as the team's vice president of player personnel. On October 13, 2016, the Mercury signed Brondello to a multi-year contract extension.

Known for her intense preparation for each opponent, Brondello has compiled an overall regular season record of 131-95 in her first seven seasons with the Mercury, ranking her first on the all-time wins list as a Mercury coach. Additionally, Brondello has compiled a 18-13 postseason record at the helm of the Mercury, ranking her as the winningest coach in franchise history in the postseason. She was named the 2014 WNBA Coach of the Year marking the first time a Mercury coach picked up the honor. She led the team to a WNBA regular season-record 29 wins and capped the season with a WNBA Championship.

An 15-year veteran of the WNBA coaching ranks, Brondello has been affiliated with the league for 21 of the league's 24 seasons, including her time as a player. A

proven winner internationally and in the WNBA, her 15 total years as an assistant coach and head coach have featured 11 playoff appearances, including seven semifinals round berths (formerly conference finals), the 2014 WNBA Championship and a spot in the 2008 WNBA Finals. Brondello joins the Mercury after serving as lead assistant coach for the Los Angeles Sparks (2011-13) under 2012 WNBA Coach of the Year Carol Ross. Brondello led the San Antonio Silver Stars to a 2010 playoff berth in her lone season at the helm following

five seasons on the Silver Stars bench as an assistant under Dan Hughes (2005-09), the third-winningest coach in league

nistory.

A 2010 inductee into the Australian Basketball Hall of Fame, Brondello was named the 11th head coach for the Australian Women's National Basketball team on April 17, 2017. While she continues to serve in her role as head coach for the Mercury, Brondello will spend her off seasons preparing the Aussies for a trip to the 2021 Summer Olympics in Tokyo. Most recently, Brondello led the Australian National Team to the gold medal in the 2018 Commonwealth Games, finishing with a perfect 5-0 in the games and winning by an average of 53 points per game.

During the WNBA offseason, Brondello used to serve as an assistant coach with Russian League team UMMC Ekaterinburg. Now the Mercury's head of player personnel,

Phoenix's pro scouting efforts are buoyed by Brondello's knowledge of and exposure to overseas talent.

Brondello finished a stellar 17-year professional playing career with a five-year run in the WNBA in which she played for Detroit (1998-99), Miami (2001-02) and Seattle (2003), and was named a 1999 WNBA All-Star. She began her career with the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia (1986-96), and was named the league MVP in 1995. The 5-7 guard was a 10-time German Cup champion while playing with BTV Wuppertal (1992-2002), a three-time European Cup All-Star selection (1994, 1996, 1997), and the 1996 European Cup MVP when she led her team to the title.

An 18-year member of the Australian National Team, Brondello is a four-time Olympian, a two-time silver medalist (2000, 2004) and was named the 1992 Australian International Player of the Year. In her time with the national team, she was a teammate of former Mercury forward, and current Director of Player Performance for Phoenix, Penny Taylor.

Brondello is married to Olaf Lange, who is an assitant coach for the Chicago Sky, and the couple has two children, Brody and Jayda.
