In the Mercury's season opener against the Dallas Wings on Friday, May 18, 2018, Diana Taurasi became the first and only WNBA player in history to reach 1,000 career made three-pointers. MVP TAURASI?: In her 17th season at the age of 38, Diana Taurasi become an MVP contender this year, finishing fifth in the league in scoring (18.7 ppg) and eighth in assists ( 4.5 apg ). MAMBA MENTALITY: In the Mercury's game on August 23 against Washington, Diana Taurasi wore a No. 8 'BRYANT' jersey for the duration of the game on what would have been Kobe's 42nd birthday. Taurasi finished with a season-high 34 points after knocking down seven triples in the game. In the game, Taurasi became the first player in WNBA history to record at least 34 points, 4 rebounds, 3 assists, 2 blocks, make 7 three-pointers, make 10 free throws and shoot at least $52 \%$ from the field. The only player in NBA history to do so was Kobe Bryant on Jan. 31, 2007.

20-7-2 CLUB: In 31 games last season Brittney Griner averaged 20.7 points, 7.2 rebounds and 2.0 blocks per game, making her the only player in the WNBA in 2019 to average at least 20 points, 7 rebounds and 2 blocks per game this year. As the only player in WNBA history to average at least 20-7-2 in more than two seasons (2017-19), she joins Anthony Davis, Elton Brand, Shaquille O'Neal and Jermaine O'Neal as the only WNBA/NBA players since 2000 the average 20-7-2 in three consecutive seasons.

AIN'T NOTHIN BUT A"BG" THANG: Mercury center Brittney Griner continues to prove that she may just be the greatest rim protector in league history, as she ranks 3rd on the WNBA's all-time blocks list with 658 blocks in only 224 career games (ranks 1st among active players)...After leading the league in total blocks during the 2016 season for a fourth-straight year with 107, she recorded her third consecutive year with 100+ blocks in a season, becoming just the second WNBA player (Margo Dydek) to do so.. After finishing second in total blocks in 2017 with 65 (missed 8 games due to injury - Sylvia Fowles and Elizabeth Williams each finished with 67 blocks that
season and appeared in all 34 games), Griner led the league in total blocks in 2018 with 87, 20 more than second place (Natasha Howard - 67)...Griner averaged 3.1 blocks per game in 2016, making her the first WNBA player in history to average 3.0+ blocks per game in each of her first four seasons... The last player in the NBA to average 3.0 blocks per game in each of his first four seasons in the NBA was Shawn Bradley (1993-94 to 1996-97)...She also became the 11th player in WNBA history to record 400 career blocks on 9/2 at Connecticut...She did so in 115 career games, making her the fastest player in WNBA history to reach 400 career blocks. COACHING STAFF: Mercury head coach Sandy Brondello returns for her seventh year with the Mercury...Brondello was signed to a multi-year contract following the 2016 season on October 13, 2016....Brondello is assisted by Julie Hairgrove (16th season), the longest tenured assistant coach in the WNNBA, and former WNBA player Chasity Melvin (1st season)...The Mercury also afeature Zach O'Brien to its staff as Player Development Coach. Brondello has a career record of 145-114 as head coach in the WNBA and a 131-94 record with the Mercury as head coach, the winningest coach in franchise history. Additionally, she has the most playoff wins by a coach in Mercury history with 17. In the Mercury's win on August 4, 2020 againt Atlanta, Brondello moved into 10th place on the WNBA's all-time wins list with 135 career wins.

NEW FACES WITH THE MERCURY: Following a busy free agency period, the Mercury feature several new faces on this year's squad. Of the 10-player roster in Phoenix, 50 percent of last year's squad remains in Diana Taurasi, Brittney Griner, Alanna Smith, Sophie Cunningham and Brianna Turner. New to this year's team is Skylar Diggins-Smith (aquired in a trade with Dallas), Kia Vaughn (signed as a free agent), Bria Hartley (signed as a free agent), Nia Coffey (aquired in a three-team trade from Atlanta) and Shatori Walker-Kimbrough (aquired in a trade on draft night from New York). Additionally, the Mercury aquired Jessica Breland in the same trade as Coffey, however Breland will miss the 2020 season after receiving a medical exemption.

THE SECOND SEASON: The Phoenix Mercury enter the 2020 WNBA Playoffs with an all-time postseason record of 41-33 (.554).....the Mercury is one of five teams in WNBA history with 30 or more playoff wins and one-of-four teams in WNBA history with three or more championships (Houston, 4; Minnesota, 4; Detroit, 3; Los Angeles, 3).....Phoenix qualified for the postseson for the 15th time this season and is one of three WNBA franchises in history with 15 or more playoff appearances.

MERC PLAYOFFS: The Mercury clinched its franchiserecord eighth consecutive playoff berth this season. It will be Phoenix's 12th playoff appearance in last 14 seasons and the 15th in the franchise's 24-year history.

PEDDY'S BIG NIGHT: Shey Peddy was the hero of the night in the Mercury's 85-84 win over the Washington Mystics on September 15, knocking down a threepointer from the corner as time expired to seal the win and advance Phoenix into the second round of the WNBA playoffs. Peddy, who was initially signed to a
seven-day contract by the Mercury on August 19 after being waived by the Washington Mystics, came off the bench to finish with 12 points, 4 rebounds and 3 steals. It marked the 11th time in WNBA history a player has come off the bench in the WNBA postseason and finished with at least such numbers, and the first time in Mercury franchise history (h/t Across The Timeline).

PEDDY'S JOURNEY: Shey Peddy has had quite the journey up to her game-winning shot last night. Below is a timeline of her WNBA career (h/t Lindsay Gibbs, @ linzsports)

She knocks down the gamewinning three-pointer as time expires to eliminate her former team, the Mystics.


Veteran WNBA player, coach and former Australian Olympian Sandy Brondello (braun-DELL-oh) was named the ninth head coach in franchise history on November 15, 2013. Brondello also serves as the team's vice president of player personnel. On October 13, 2016, the Mercury signed Brondello to a multi-year contract extension.

Known for her intense preparation for each opponent, Brondello has compiled an overall regular season record of 131-95 in her first seven seasons with the Mercury, ranking her first on the all-time wins list as a Mercury coach. Additionally, Brondello has compiled a 18-13 postseason record at the helm of the Mercury, ranking her as the winningest coach in franchise history in the postseason. She was named the 2014 WNBA Coach of the Year marking the first time a Mercury coach picked up the honor. She led the team to a WNBA regular season-record 29 wins and capped the season with a WNBA Championship.

An 15-year veteran of the WNBA coaching ranks, Brondello has been affiliated with the league for 21 of the league's 24 seasons, including her time as a player. A proven winner internationally and in the WNBA, her 15 total years as an assistant coach and head coach have featured 11 playoff appearances, including seven semifinals round berths (formerly conference finals), the 2014 WNBA Championship and a spot in the 2008 WNBA Finals. Brondello joins the Mercury after serving as lead assistant coach for the Los Angeles Sparks (2011-13) under 2012 WNBA Coach of the Year Carol Ross. Brondello led the San Antonio Silver Stars to a 2010 playoff berth in her lone season at the helm following five seasons on the Silver Stars bench as an assistant under Dan Hughes (2005-09), the third-winningest coach in league history.

A 2010 inductee into the Australian Basketball Hall of Fame, Brondello was named the 11th head coach for the Australian Women's National Basketball team on April 17, 2017. While she continues to serve in her role as head coach for the Mercury, Brondello will spend her off seasons preparing the Aussies for a trip to the 2021 Summer Olympics in Tokyo. Most recently, Brondello led the Australian National Team to the gold medal in the 2018 Commonwealth Games, finishing with a perfect 5-0 in the games and winning by an average of 53 points per game.

During the WNBA offseason, Brondello used to serve as an assistant coach with Russian League team UMMC

Brondello finished a stellar 17-year professional playing career with a five-year run in the WNBA in which she played for Detroit (1998-99), Miami (2001-02) and Seattle (2003), and was named a 1999 WNBA All-Star. She began her career with the Women's National Basketball League (WNBL) in Australia (1986-96), and was named the league MVP in 1995. The 5-7 guard was a 10-time German Cup champion while playing with BTV Wuppertal (1992-2002), a three-time European Cup All-Star selection (1994, 1996, 1997), and the 1996 European Cup MVP when she led her team to the title.

An 18-year member of the Australian National Team, Brondello is a four-time Olympian, a two-time silver medalist $(2000,2004)$ and was named the 1992 Australian International Player of the Year. In her time with the national team, she was a teammate of former Mercury forward, and current Director of Player Performance for Phoenix, Penny Taylor.

Brondello is married to Olaf Lange, who is an assitant coach for the Chicago Sky, and the couple has two children, Brody and Jayda.
